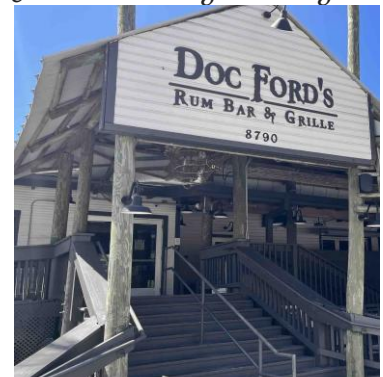

### **Hot, Hot, Hot!!! Is It Too Hot to Fish?**

As I look at the forecast for the next few days on my phone, there isn't a single day with a high temperature below 90 degrees.

On average, July is the hottest month in the Tampa Bay region, with daytime highs around 92 degrees. Last year, on July 27, Tampa International Airport recorded a scorching 100 degrees, breaking the previous record of 98 degrees that had stood since 1942.

So, is it too hot to fish?

During the middle of the day, I'd say yes. But if you focus on the early morning hours or head out after the sun goes down, fishing can still be very enjoyable—and a lot more comfortable. In fact, this is one of the best times of year to target fish around dock lights at night, where the lights attract baitfish and predators alike.

I hope you don't let the summer heat keep you off the water. Just be smart about it. Stay hydrated, wear lightweight sun-protective clothing, apply sunscreen, and take advantage of the cooler parts of the day.

Stay safe, drink plenty of water, and I'll see you on the water!

## John French: July 18 Outing -- Freshwater or Saltwater

Our July 18 outing is another fresh and/or saltwater opportunity. Salty anglers can fish upper Tampa Bay north of the Howard Frankland Bridge. Freshwater anglers can fish Alligator Lake in Safety Harbor, Alligator Creek in Clearwater, and Cooper's Bayou Pond in Safety Harbor.

We meet up at noon at Pavilion #5 in Philippe Park to gobble up Publix fried chicken, potato salad, coleslaw, and (of course) cookies.

Gift certificates will go to the salty anglers catching the longest redfish and longest ladyfish. Freshwater anglers are going for the longest bass and the most panfish. Be sure to measure and take pictures of your possible winners.

## Capt. Ray Markham: Beatin' the Heat. Night snookin'

So far, this year's off to a real scorcher. Summer doldrums seem to have arrived early, and I'm guessing they won't be in much of a hurry to see fall. But picking conditions to be on the water can not only make for a more comfortable time to fish, but also be the most productive in terms of catch numbers.

Most anglers know that snook are nocturnal. It doesn't mean they don't eat during the day, but these fish are at the height of their foraging at night, when they're looking to chew. It got me thinking this week when I was fishing in an area adjacent to some flats near a pass where I know snook congregate and move back and forth over a day. It was still, and air

temperatures approached an all-time high as water temperatures rose well into the 90s. It made thoughts of fishing the hours after nightfall sound very appealing.

Perhaps you might be able to fish almost any night, but which nights should be most productive? That can depend on several factors, but the prime time will be around the nights of the new moon each month, particularly in summer. You'll not only have good, solid moving water with the evening outgoing tides, but you'll also see fish concentrate in and around the perimeter of dock lights and bridge fender lights, making them easier to target, as long as you stay far enough off of your targeted fish to avoid spooking them.



These lights will attract forage like pilchards, glass minnows, and shrimp. So, for me, matching the hatch with a fly is not that difficult when choosing patterns to take with you. One of my long-time favorites is the Carl Hanson Mono Body Glass Minnow.

Back in the 70's, I used to go to Carl's house weekly for fly tying and catching up on a few fishing lies with some of the local guys from the fly club. Carl had some very strong opinions on flies, fly casting, and fishing, and you were more than welcome to them. Bear, a somewhat fluffy but a bit moth-eaten looking Pomeranian pooch, was often chosen for a donation to the materials of whatever fly was being tied that night.

But for me, Carl's white Mono Body Glass Minnow with a little pearl crystal flash and a body wrapped with monofilament line over aluminum foil and a bit of red thread tied for gills in a length no larger than a match stick produced some amazing catches of snook, trout, and even some mangrove snapper when fished around the docks and bridges on those nights under the artificial light. The near-suspended action of the fly was perfect for these fish.

While possibly the most notable snook fly might be the Clouser Minnow, another favorite of mine is a white DT Special with 4 splayed white feathers tied on a #1-1/0 hook and a length overall of about three or four inches with a couple of white saddle hackles palmered at the front of the fly. Snook would crush it! ([Watch this!](#))

Plan your next outing in the cool of the night and give some lighted docks or bridge fenders a toss with an 8 or 9-weight fly rod using one of these patterns. You'll be amazed at how hot fishing can be when you aren't.

### Materials

UV polar chenille, tied sparsely!  
Hooks, 3407 or stingers, sizes 1-front, 2 rear or similar.  
Ice dub shimmer fringe; ghost flash or similar.  
Steel wire for the joint connection.  
Thread- white, silver or mono.  
Eyes, large stick on eyes.  
Glue, eye glue and UV epoxy

## David Redd: Bend Back Shrimp

*David Redd led fly tyers through the steps tying the Bend Back Shrimp at Bruce Evensen's fly tying studio on Monday, June 22.*

### Materials

1. Hook: #4 Mustad C84BAP Shrimp Back or comparable bend back hook, Mustad 34007 or comparable bendable hook.
2. Eyes: large plastic bead chain or mono shrimp eyes.
3. Body: Ice Dub UV in Shrimp Pink or orange, medium cactus chenille or estaz can also be used. Senyo's Laser dub in tan. Again, medium chenille or Estaz can be used. Root beer, tan or light brown bucktail, sand or tan craft fur.
4. Flash: Tan, or gold Krystal Flash or comparable.
5. Legs: Rubber pumpkin, orange or light brown silly legs.
6. Glue: head cement or super glue.
7. Helpful tools: a dubbing brush or Velcro, dubbing wax.



## Brian Henderson: Mole Crab, Sand Flea Variant

*Brian Henderson led fly tyers through the steps tying the Mole Crab (like a sand flea) at Bruce Evensen's fly tying studio on Monday, June 29.*

### Materials

1. Hook: Gamakatsu SL12S or similar, size 1/0 to size 2
2. Eyes: dumbbell eyes, hot orange if you have them
3. Legs: Shrimp orange silly legs
4. Mandible: Tan Marabou - We'll be using fluffy tips so you don't need your best feathers.
5. Body: EP Fiber - clear/polar bear-esque, tan, white or a light crab blend - you know, so it looks like a sand flea - we will blend if you have single colors.
6. Body hot spot: Bright orange Estaz.



## Abby Gambrel: Lefty's Deceiver

*Abby led fly tyers through the steps for Lefty's Deceiver on July 6.*

*Here's Abby: "We're going classic baitfish with a deceiver! I will tie a white deceiver with accent colors on the top line, but there are endless combinations. Color options (adjust colors noted in materials accordingly): classic white with colored bucktail (chartreuse, blue), blurple (black and purple), or any other combination you think the fish will find tasty."*

### Materials:

1. Hook: size 4 through 2/0 (Mustad 34007 or similar)
2. Thread: white, but could also use a contrasting color if you want the head to be different
3. Tail: 2x Matched feathers (can use saddle hackle or hen cape, 2-3x length of hook shank)
4. Body: Flat braid OR a mix of flash
5. Wing: Buck tail in white, contrasting color(s)
6. Flash: pearl Krystal flash (or another complimentary color)
7. Throat: red Flashabou (I will have some if you don't)
8. Topping: A few pieces of peacock herl (I'll have some if you don't)
9. Eyes: STICK ON EYES, 4-6 MM
